We are excited to present a new addition of resources for classrooms to use to express their creativity. With the help of Board Chair, Joanne Rahn and retired preschool teacher, Rita Thompson, a new recycling center has been established near the supply cabinets in the west muscle room. Our mission is to promote creativity, environmental awareness, and community outreach through reusable materials. Have you noticed the recycled black spools in the muscle rooms? What about the recycled materials in the classroom?

A variety of items such as nuts, bolts, wood pieces, small droppers, plastic rings, beads, wire, yarn, bubble wrap, etc. have been displayed beautifully in the recycle center strictly for repurposing. Teachers have the ability to take their children out to the area to brainstorm ideas for how the materials can be used. We encourage parents to take a minute to browse the selection. Our goal is to continue to grow the selection of materials for the children to work with and are in the process of developing a system for receiving recycled items.
